


ICM Research interviewed a tightly controlled sample of 1438 adults aged 18+ in 103 randomly selected constituencies nationwide. Interviews were conducted face-to-face between 3-4 July 1992.

Q1. General Election turnout.	
Certain not to vote	13%
Possible you would not vote	6%
Almost certain you would vote	15%
Absolutely certain you would vote	64%
Don't know	2%

Q2. Westminster Voting Intention. Adjusted. Base: All expressing an intention to vote.	
 Conservatives	45%
 Labour	36%
 Liberal Democrats	15%
 Other	5%
 LEAD	9%

Q3. Which party do you think has the best policies for dealing with the economy?	
Conservative	38%
Labour	23%
Liberals/ other	7%
Don't know/ none of them	33%

Q4. Who do you think has the more reliable views on Britain's future in Europe, John Major or Margaret Thatcher?	
John Major	61%
Margaret Thatcher	24%
Don't know	15%

Q5. When do you think Labour is likely to return to power in Britain?	
At the next general election	18%
Not at the next election but before the end of the century	16%
Not until after the year 2000	20%
