



ICM Research interviewed a random sample of 1205 adults aged 18+ by telephone between 16-17th April 1999. Interviews were conducted across the country and the results have been weighted to the profile of all adults.

<b>Q1. How likely would you be to vote in an immediate general election?</b>	
10 - Absolutely certain to vote	57%

<b>Q2. If there were to be a general election tomorrow which party do you think you would vote for? ADJUSTED.</b>

<b>Q3. As you may know Britain is involved as part of NATO in the bombing of Serbia. Do you think that it is right or wrong for Britain to take part in NATO raids?</b>
