

ICM Research interviewed a random sample of 1203 adults aged 18+ by telephone between 14th-15th March 2000. Interviews were conducted across the country and the results have been weighted to the profile of all adults.

**Q3. Do you think that with what is happening to Rover Cars and other manufacturing businesses the possibility of redundancies among the workforce will make you less likely to vote Labour at the next General Election or will it make no real difference one way or the other?**
