



ICM Research interviewed a random sample of 1061 adults aged 18+ by telephone between 23rd - 26th June, 2000. Interviews were conducted across the country and the results have been weighted to the profile of all adults.

Q1. General Election turnout.	
Absolutely certain to vote	49%
Very likely to vote	19%
Quite likely to vote	13%
Unlikely to vote	6%
Very unlikely to vote	5%
Certain not to vote	7%
Don't know	1%

Q2. General Election voting intention. Adjusted. Base: All expressing an intention to vote.	
Conservative	32%
Labour	43%
Lib Dem	17%
Other	8%
Lead	11%

Q3. If there were to be a referendum would you vote to join the Single European currency, or vote not to join?	
Vote to join	23%
Vote not to join	58%
Don't know	19%

Q4. Leaving aside how you would vote, in 10 years time, which of the following do you think is most likely?	
The Euro will be the currency of most of Europe, Britain included	40%
The Euro will be the currency of most of Europe, but Britain will have retained the Pound	25%
The Euro will have failed and each European country will have their own currency	24%
Don't know	11%

Q5. How do you think the government handled the hooligan problem during Euro 2000?	
Well	4%
About right	7%

Poorly	45%
It would have happened anyway	39%
Don't know	6%

Q6. England is bidding to host the football World Cup in 2006 and the decision will be announced next week. Following the Euro 2000 tournament do you back England's bid to stage the World Cup, or do you think it should go elsewhere?

Yes - back England's bid	49%
No - should go elsewhere	42%

Q7. At present convicted soccer hooligans can have their passports taken away to prevent them travelling to international football matches. Some people have suggested that SUSPECTED soccer hooligans should also have their passports taken away as well. Do you think that?

Passports of convicted AND suspected hooligans should be taken away	48%
No passports should be taken away	6%
